"I wish to go to the Oceanarium!"

NDM, 5, retinoblastoma (WC24042)

NDM adores animals, especially cats and fish. After chancing upon videos of the newly opened Singapore Oceanarium, she has been longing to see all its sea creatures in person, and is especially excited to spot the frogs on display. We will arrange a special tour for her and her family on the day, with fun activities along the way so she can earn her very own achievement certificate at the end.

Mobility and Equipment

"I wish to have a motorised wheelchair!"

LXY, 15, cerebral palsy (WC24053)

LXY is a determined teenager who currently relies fully on others for mobility, as his condition makes an independent manual wheelchair difficult to use. Through training at school, he has been learning to use a powered wheelchair and is progressing well indoors. A powered wheelchair of his own would let him practise more at home and in the community, growing his independence, confidence, and participation in everyday activities.

"I wish to have a wheelchair!"

JTKY, 3, meningoencephalitis (WC25149)

JTKY is a spirited 3-year-old girl living with meningoencephalitis, a condition that affects her strength, movement, and postural control. She needs significant support for transfers and has poor neck and trunk control, putting her at risk of further postural complications such as scoliosis as she grows. She currently uses a loaned Rifton Activity Chair and has no customised seating system of her own. Her wish is for her first custom equipment provision, giving her the posture, comfort, and positioning support she needs for daily life, while protecting her growing body and improving her quality of life at home.

"I wish to have a wheelchair!"

MID, 18, CRASH Syndrome (WC26045)

MID communicates through gestures, picture cards, sounds, and laughter, expressing joy with an audible "ah." Living with Global Developmental Delay and CRASH Syndrome, conditions that affect his mobility, communication, and daily functioning, he currently self-propels a manual wheelchair. As he moves into adulthood, he needs a wheelchair and seating system properly fitted to his current body size and long-term mobility needs. This wish will give MID greater comfort, safety, and independence, while supporting his father, his main caregiver, at home and in the community.

"I wish to have a wheelchair!"

AJ, 7, spastic dystonic cerebral palsy, epilepsy (WC26059)

AJ is a 7-year-old boy living with spastic dystonic quadriplegic cerebral palsy, complicated by epilepsy, visual impairment, and swallowing difficulties. To put him at ease and calm him, he enjoys heated swimming pools, and listening to soothing music like the piano and the flute. His current stroller, purchased in 2021, no longer provides enough support for his posture, particularly for his spine and hips. His new custom wheelchair, a Zippie TS Tilt-in-Space, is designed to support his posture now and as he grows, easing the load on his caregiver and making it easier for him to get out and enjoy family outings.

"I wish to have a wheelchair!"

BMF, 16, epilepsy (WC26065)

BMF is a joyful teenager who loves people-watching at the mall, spending time outside, and watching young children play. She lives with cerebral palsy, epilepsy, and severe scoliosis, and has spent her life in a second-hand wheelchair that was never built for her body. This wish will give her a first ever custom-built wheelchair, designed around her unique posture, so she can finally sit in comfort and spend more time outdoors. The chair is built to grow with her and is expected to last around ten years.

"I wish to have a wheelchair!"

SS, 11, cerebral palsy (WC26002)

SS enjoys interacting with others, and her favourite toy to play with are balls. At home, she currently has no supportive seating system, relying instead on a pram for getting to and from school that she has now outgrown and that does not encourage good posture. Her new wheelchair will give her a stable, comfortable seating system that supports her spine, helps prevent further complications, and encourages her to take part and engage more fully both at home and in school.

"I wish to have a wheelchair!"

ETJY, 9, West syndrome (WC26063)

ETJY is a 9-year-old boy living with West syndrome, alongside refractory epilepsy and global developmental delay, and requires long-term medication to manage his seizures. He needs support with daily activities and is functionally dependent for mobility, requiring assistance with pressure relief and special seating due to a high risk of body structural deformity. Non-verbal, ETJY finds joy in classical music. He is currently using an old buggy that he has outgrown and that can no longer support his seating posture or be adjusted to suit his growth. His new custom wheelchair, a Zippie TS Tilt-in-Space, is fitted to his size, with adjustable features that will grow with him.

"I wish to have a wheelchair!"

RRS, 17, lumbosacral myelomeningocele (spina bifida) (WC26060)

RRS lives with spina bifida, which has affected his lower-limb strength and posture and caused leg length discrepancy and scoliosis. Though he can walk short distances with ankle-foot orthoses and mobility aids, he experiences fatigue and pain over longer distances or when using ramps. His current basic manual wheelchair offers no customised postural support, and prolonged sitting at school has caused pain in his spine and legs. His wish is for a customised wheelchair with proper cushioning, backrest, and support, so he can move more comfortably and take part more independently in school and daily life.

Room Enhancements

"I wish to have a room enhancement!"

HZBR, 17, pulmonary atresia with ventricular septal defect (WC25117)

HZBR is a gentle, reserved young woman living with a rare and complex congenital heart condition. Following complications from a recent surgery and over 8 months in hospital, her condition has changed significantly, and she now relies on medical equipment and a wheelchair for daily living. As she spends much of her time at home in her room, her wish is for a purple-themed room enhancement that is both comforting and practical: a new wardrobe and improved layout to keep her medical supplies and daily necessities neatly organised, in a beautiful, calming space she can truly call her own.

"I wish to have a room enhancement!"

MYBZ, 15, West syndrome and Global Development Delay (WC22106)

MYBZ lives with West syndrome, a rare and severe form of epilepsy, and depends entirely on his mother, his sole caregiver, for daily care. When he is not in school, most of his time is spent in bed, so the room he lives in matters enormously, both to his comfort and to his mother's ability to care for him. His wish is for a custom-built room he can share with her: a space that is small but thoughtfully designed, with a bed, dedicated storage for his medical supplies, a display area for his plush toys, and a television to keep him entertained. Beyond comfort for MYBZ, this wish is designed to ease his mother's day-to-day caregiving.

"I wish to have a room enhancement!"

ETHT, 18, superior mesenteric artery syndrome with parenteral nutrition dependence (WC26025)

ETHT has spent the past two years navigating a difficult medical journey, including multiple hospitalisations and a long diagnostic process that led to her being managed on total parenteral nutrition. She spends much of her time at home, in a room she describes as cluttered and dusty. Her wish is to transform that space into somewhere calm and personal, with freshly painted walls, new furniture, and a layout built around her own aesthetic, including proper display shelves for her Pop Mart collection, organised by series. After a long stretch of medical uncertainty, this wish gives ETHT something she can shape for herself: a space that reflects who she is, not just where she recovers.

WWL, 13, medulloblastoma (WC26050)

WWL loves gaming and watching anime, including Jujutsu Kaisen and Haikyuu. When deciding on her wish, she carefully weighed a laptop against a tablet, and chose the tablet for its size and convenience, since she does not game extensively. Her wish team also plans to help her decorate the tablet so it truly feels like her own, along with protective peripherals to help it last for the long term.

JWM, 16, acute myeloid leukemia (WC25100)

JWM is a mature teenager who has been out of school for some time due to treatment for acute myeloid leukemia. JWM enjoys studying and hopes for a new MacBook so she can stay connected to family and friends and continue her education, even while confined to hospital.

DAK is a playful, bubbly four-year-old who arrived at 25 weeks and has faced more than his share of challenges since: a cancer diagnosis at just 10 months old, and more recently, cerebral palsy. He is now well enough to spend more time outside the hospital and is eager to take in everything the world has to offer. DAK's wish is to visit Tokyo Disneyland and meet Mickey Mouse and friends, a dream made even more exciting after his best friend's recent trip to Disneyland. This will be her first trip to Korea, and a deeply meaningful one: she completed her transplant last year and has just received the all clear from her doctors to travel for her wish.
