**“I wish to have a new wheelchair!”**

**TSTH, 15, West syndrome (WC17178)**

TSTH is a 14-year-old girl who relies on her mother for all her daily needs. Although she has had a specialised seating system previously, she is outgrowing it quickly. At her recent X-ray scan, it showed that TSTH’s scoliosis is worsening, and she will require a new wheelchair to support her growing size. This new wheelchair will optimise her seating posture and accommodate her developmental needs. It consists of various support functions for her trunk, head, and feet, thus keep her body in place while in the chair. This allows TSTH to sit comfortably, and to continue engaging in her school activities regularly.

**GORX, 4, pilocytic astrocytoma with severe posterior fossa syndrome (WC25094)**

Before her diagnosis, GO's family had already planned for a trip to Perth. However when she was diagnosed, it all had to be put on hold. She has since got the green light from her medical team, and is able to travel to take the trip she was originally meant to go on! As a big lover of animals, she will be visiting and interacting with both farm and zoo animals in Perth. She's especially looking forward to the koalas and kangaroos. Through the wish GO and her family hope to have her experience the world beyond the hospital. NH used to share the room with his brothers, but since his diagnosis, he's had to stay in a separate room from them to avoid common illnesses like the flu. He wishes to convert their current prayer room to his bedroom to include an: an aircon as it is uncomfortable for him to sleep at night, a new cupboard because the current one is broken and a bed frame as he is currently on a mattress. Through the wish, he hopes to have a more conducive place for him to recover and study for his upcoming exams.

Through training in school, LXY has been learning to use a powered wheelchair and is progressing well in navigating indoor spaces. He enjoys the independence and confidence it gives him to move around on his own. Having a powered wheelchair of his own would allow LXY to practise more regularly at home and in the community, increasing his independence, confidence, and participation in everyday activities.

**HZBR, 13, pulmonary atresia with ventricular septal defect (WC25117)**

HZBR is a gentle and reserved young girl living with a rare and complex congenital heart condition. Following complications from a recent surgery and over 8 months in hospital, her condition has changed significantly, and she now relies on medical equipment and a wheelchair for daily living. As HZBR spends much of her time at home in her room, her wish is for a purple-themed room enhancement that is both comforting and practical. A new wardrobe and improved room setup would help keep her medical supplies, equipment, and daily necessities neatly organised, while giving HZBR a beautiful, calming space she can truly call her own.

**MIDBJ, 18, CRASH syndrome (WC26045)**

MIDBJ is an 18-year-old young man diagnosed with Global Developmental Delay and CRASH syndrome, with long-term complications that affect his mobility, communication, and daily functioning. He communicates through gestures, picture cards, sounds, and laughter, and can express enjoyment by making an “ah” sound. MIDBJ currently depends on a manual wheelchair and is able to self-propel independently, but as he transitions into adulthood, he needs a wheelchair and seating system that properly fits his current body size and supports his long-term mobility needs. This wish would help MIDBJ continue moving around with greater comfort, safety, and independence, while giving his father, the main caregiver, better support in caring for him at home and in the community.

**JTKY, 4, meningoencephalitis (WC25149)**

JTKY is a 4-year-old girl diagnosed with meningoencephalitis, a condition that affects her strength, movement, and postural control. She requires significant support for transfers and has poor neck and trunk control, placing her at risk of developing further postural complications such as scoliosis as she grows. JTKY is currently using a Rifton Activity Chair on loan, but she does not yet have a customised seating system of her own. Her wish is to receive her first custom equipment provision, which would provide the posture, comfort, and positioning support she needs for daily activities, while helping to protect her growing body and improve her quality of life at home.

**KP, 4, acute myeloid leukemia (WC25158)**

KP is a pleasant and outgoing young girl who is able to express her needs and preferences, and who loves art, books, number blocks, Paw Patrol, and all things Disney. After missing out on a Disney Cruise trip with family friends because of her condition, KP's wish is to visit Hong Kong Disneyland with her family and create the special memories she had been looking forward to. Having recently completed treatment and now attending follow-up reviews, this trip would be a meaningful celebration for KP and her caring family. At Disneyland, Kelly hopes to meet her favourite Disney characters and princesses, enjoy the rides and playgrounds, play at the beach, and, of course, eat Mickey Mouse ice cream. In school, RGYJ practises walking using a Rifton Pacer walker, where he is able to initiate steps with gentle support from an adult. Having his very own walker at home would give RGYJ the opportunity to practise walking more regularly as part of his everyday routines. With consistent use, the walker can help build his lower limb strength, endurance, and mobility, while allowing him to participate more actively in family activities and interactions at home.

**KEN, 14, Antley Bixler syndrome (WC25065)**

KEN is a 14-year-old girl who communicates mostly by sign language, or by writing on her iPad. She is an only child, well-loved by her two parents who have centred their care around her. As the family will be moving into a new flat later this year, KEN wishes to customise her new room with specific furniture that both reflects her growing personality, as well as functions to assist with her physical exercises to manage her scoliosis. With this in mind, KEN came up with a list of items for her new room, and is excited to make this space her own!

**ALJJ, 18, Duchenne muscular dystrophy (WC26018)**

He has been identified by his school to attend a sheltered workshop 4 days a week, which is preparing him with skills for simple jobs after he graduates this year. To keep up with his physical development, AL wishes to have a new motorised wheelchair, as his current one no longer provides the postural support that he requires. Due to his medical condition, AL's muscles will continue to weaken over time, hence he will require even more support over the years. This new wheelchair will include an additional tilt function as well as stronger back support, both of which can be adaptable to AL's growing needs through time.
