Currently, he uses a manual wheelchair which he self-propels, however, this is getting more and more physically challenging as he gets older. His mother is his primary caregiver, however, she is ageing too and has reported significant physical strain in pushing him around. CTQ wishes to have a motorised wheelchair to alleviate these physical burdens. This will allow him to travel longer distances safely, thus opening up more opportunities for him to engage in community activities. CTQ has completed formal training in manoeuvring a motorised wheelchair on public transport, and looks forward to the newfound independence this can bring him.

In school, RGYJ practises walking using a Rifton Pacer walker, where he is able to initiate steps with gentle support from an adult. Having his very own walker at home would give RGYJ the opportunity to practise walking more regularly as part of his everyday routines. With consistent use, the walker can help build his lower limb strength, endurance, and mobility, while allowing him to participate more actively in family activities and interactions at home.

KEN is a 14-year-old girl who communicates mostly by sign language, or by writing on her iPad. She is an only child, well-loved by her two parents who have centred their care around her. As the family will be moving into a new flat later this year, KEN wishes to customise her new room with specific furniture that both reflects her growing personality, as well as functions to assist with her physical exercises to manage her scoliosis. LXY, 16, cerebral palsy (WC24053)

LXY is a determined 16-year-old who currently relies fully on adults to assist with mobility, as his condition makes it difficult for him to use a manual wheelchair independently. Through training in school, LXY has been learning to use a powered wheelchair and is progressing well in navigating indoor spaces. He enjoys the independence and confidence it gives him to move around on his own. Having a powered wheelchair of his own would allow LXY to practise more regularly at home and in the community, increasing his independence, confidence, and participation in everyday activities.

KKKO, 7, cerebral palsy and epilepsy (WC25075)

KK is a 7 years-old boy with cerebral palsy and epilepsy. As the youngest family member, KK is well loved and doted on by all his siblings. Being a growing boy, the main caregivers are finding it tougher these days to lift him and to bring him out for walks - something that he enjoys. With a new wheelchair, KK will be able to be brought out more often to enjoy his outdoor walks and have more family time.

NHBMR, 16, chronic myeloid leukemia (WC25160)

NH used to share the room with his brothers, but since his diagnosis he's had to stay in a separate room from them to avoid common illnesses like the flu. He wishes to convert their current prayer room to his bedroom to include an: an aircon as it is uncomfortable for him to sleep at night, a new cupboard because the current one is broken and a bed frame as he is currently on a mattress. Through the wish, he hopes to have a more conducive place for him to recover and study for his upcoming exams.

**“I wish to have a new wheelchair!”
TSTH, 15, West syndrome (WC17178)**

TSTH is a 14-year-old girl who relies on her mother for all her daily needs. Although she has had a specialised seating system previously, she is outgrowing it quickly. At her recent X-ray scan, it showed that TSTH’s scoliosis is worsening, and she will require a new wheelchair to support her growing size. This new wheelchair will optimise her seating posture and accommodate her developmental needs. It consists of various support functions for her trunk, head, and feet, thus keep her body in place while in the chair. This allows TSTH to sit comfortably, and to continue engaging in her school activities regularly.

ALJJ, 18, Duchenne muscular dystrophy (WC26018)**

AL is an 18-year-old teenager who attends special school at CPAS. He has been identified by his school to attend a sheltered workshop 4 days a week, which is preparing him with skills for simple jobs after he graduates this year. To keep up with his physical development, AL wishes to have a new motorised wheelchair, as his current one no longer provides the postural support that he requires. Due to his medical condition, AL's muscles will continue to weaken over time, hence he will require even more support over the years. This new wheelchair will include an additional tilt function as well as stronger back support, both of which can be adaptable to AL's growing needs through time.
