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## About Make-A-Wish Singapore Years of Wishes

Make-A-Wish Singapore is a part of the world's largest wish granting organisation. Since our inception in 2002, we have granted more than 1,500 life-changing wishes for children with critical illnesses. We believe wishes provide children the strength to look past their situations and limitations, assist families in overcoming their anxieties, and have the potential to galvanise entire communities in creating hope, strength and joy for the children as well as their loved ones. Most importantly, we believe that wishes can improve a child's quality of life, giving them a better chance of recovery. Make-A-Wish Singapore is supported by over 200 volunteers, 8 board members and 9 staff, and is the only wish granting organisation of its kind in Singapore.

### 39 Years of the Make-A-Wish Movement

In 1980, 7-year-old Christopher James Greicius wished to be a police officer for a day. Chris' wish inspired the eventual creation of Make-A-Wish. And since Chris' life-changing experience, Make-A-Wish has been responsible for granting the wishes of more than 500,000 children worldwide. With each wish, comes renewed strength and encouragement for every child and family we serve.

# CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

In his tenure so far, he has provided a renewed focus in ensuring wishes go beyond a fleeting moment and into a transformational journey for the child and their family.

We've continued to invest in growing and strengthening the Make-A-Wish community from nurturing invaluable corporate partnerships, to organising our first-ever Wish Granter Annual Meeting to solidify our volunteer pool of almost 200 inspiring individuals. Our events continue to bring the community together with over 4,000 Wish Children, families, volunteers and participants involved in the Charity Golf Event, Santa Run and Children's Day.

As we enter 2020 amid a COVID-19 pandemic, we anticipate obstacles in the coming months that will test our creativity, resolve, and commitment to our vision. Our first concern remains with our wish children and their families – many of whom have already been facing isolation on a daily basis to protect them from infections during their treatment.

The communities we are all part of are more important now than ever before. I am confident that we can and will remain firmly on our present course not because of our legacy but rather a belief in everyone who embodies the Make-A-Wish spirit, our fundamentals, and a commitment to delivering life-changing wishes.

Thank you for being part of this journey in bringing hope and transformation to every child diagnosed with a critical illness. They need it more than ever today.

# DO WISHES REALLY HAVE AN IMPACT?

Wishes provide children with hope when they need it most and research shows that these wishes have positive effects on children's overall well-being and health outcomes.

Wish impact studies have shown that wishes work to complement a child's medical treatment, giving children with critical illnesses greater strength in their recovery journey and hope for their future.

- **99%** of parents reported that the wish experience gave their children **increased feelings of happiness.\***

- **89%** of healthcare professionals surveyed say they believe that the wish experience can influence wish kids' physical health.\*

- **81%** of parents observe an **increased willingness** by their children to **comply with treatment protocols.\***

*Caelen, 6, spinal muscular atrophy*

Caelen, 6, was diagnosed with spinal muscular atrophy, a genetic disease that affects the nervous system resulting in lack of control of his muscles. His wish was to visit Legoland with his best friend, Branden, who shares the same medical condition.

Caelen made his own LEGO invite for Branden, which was then sent to Branden's home in Malaysia along with a Legoland map. Once Branden received the personalised handmade invitation, they both were beyond thrilled about the trip and gushed about the attractions they wished to experience. The pair of best friends unanimously agreed that Ninjago World was their 'must-go' attraction, and began counting down to the day they would meet at LEGOLAND.

A week leading up to the wish day, Caelen had the opportunity to build a skyscraper "that reaches the sky" with LEGO bricks. Brick designer, Jeffrey, from Artisan Bricks patiently guided Caelen and his family along, coaching them on how to piece the Lego bricks together properly and sketching ideas before building them. With everyone's participation, a personalised skyscraper over 1 metre tall was completed!

The highlight for Caelen's wish trip was the VIP Expedition Tour, where the families enjoyed priority access to rides and attractions, while spending time at an exclusive LEGO building workshop.

*Lia, 6, lymphoid leukaemia*

6-year-old Lia has a huge love for dinosaurs. She has a dinosaur encyclopedia, she knows the names of all her favourite dinosaurs and would introduce her dinosaur toys enthusiastically to our wish granters when they visit her.

Naturally, when asked about her one true wish, Lia wished for a party with dinosaurs and to have a fun-filled day playing with them!

To start off her wish day, Lia and her family were picked up by an arranged transport to Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum that has real dinosaur fossils. Lia also invited her friends to join her and her family for a private tour around the museum.

After touring around the exhibits and learning more about dinosaurs, Lia was surprised with a dinosaur party! It was filled with fun and exciting dinosaur-themed activities such as dino balloon sculpting and face painting, mini dino hunt, dino egg digging and dino magic show. We also prepared a huge dinosaur cake and dino party packs for Lia and her friends.

At the end of the party, Lia was presented with another grand surprise - 5 tickets to get up close and personal with the prehistoric creatures in Walking with Dinosaurs! Lia was greeted by the director, Ian Waller, and was presented with amazing Walking with Dinosaurs merchandise. Lia also scored an exclusive backstage pass to see and touch the dinosaurs and learn more about them!

## I wish to fly an aeroplane simulator!

*Lutfil, 15, brain arteriovenous malformation*

Lutfil was diagnosed with brain arteriovenous malformation (AVM), which is a tangle of abnormal blood vessels in the brain.

In Lutfil's case, he underwent an emergency surgery and was placed under a medically induced coma for about 20 days. When he came out of the coma, he could neither talk nor walk. It took a few months of intensive therapy before he regained his speech and mobility.

Now 15, Lutfil can walk, albeit with a limp. "I lost friends because some people laughed at me as I was walking unsteadily. I feel different," he said.

Then there is also the loneliness that comes from not being able to fit in with peers who are in their prime of health.

One thing that has not changed is his dream of becoming a pilot as he has been fascinated with planes since he was a boy. "This is more than what I wished for," enthused Lutfil, who wished to fly an aeroplane simulator.

On his wish day, together with Airbus Asia Training Centre (AATC) and Singapore Airline Training Centre (STC), Lutfil was given a customised pilot uniform and cap. He toured around AATC, had a briefing session with a pilot and then flew the simulator together and even had his parents and brother as passengers! Lutfil was presented with a certificate before the SIA pilots then came by to pick him up and continued his training with lessons in a classroom and practical lessons that included emergency practices such as dry and wet evacuation as well as fire situations on board. To end the day, Lutfil received his pilot wings from SIA and lots of gifts from AATC, STC and Make-A-Wish.

"My wish had impacted my life by making me more motivated and inspired in pursuing what I want to do, that is to become a pilot. I also told myself to never give up and pursue my dreams by studying hard and keep moving forward - even though the adversities and elements that I need to go through looks daunting and difficult," said Lutfil.



## I wish to be a gamer and livestream to raise funds for charity!

*Shakeel, 15, end-stage renal disease*

Shakeel was diagnosed with end-stage renal disease and he underwent a kidney transplant in August 2019. To keep his spirits up during his recovery, Shakeel's friends introduced him to Apex Legends, an online multiplayer game.

As an avid e-gaming fan and being a kind and grateful boy, Shakeel was very thankful for all the help and care he has received. As such, he selflessly wished to be a gamer so that he could raise funds through livestream and donate back to Make-A-Wish Singapore and National Kidney Foundation. Shakeel wanted to help other wish children like himself to reignite their sense of hope and imagination, and give them additional strength to battle their illnesses. "The streamers I watch are Ninja and Shroud, once they became famous, they started giving back and that's what I like about them. It inspired me to do the same as well," said Shakeel.

Working together with Sin Esport, we planned for a livestream where he would play his favourite game, Apex Legends alongside Singapore's top streamers and pro-gamers of the game, Glennda and Rigg, and a call was sent out for people to tune in and donate. Together, the gamers formed a team of three and had a 4-hour long livestream, which raised a total of \$1,040. At the end of his wish day, Shakeel was surprised when he found out that he would get to bring home the computer that he played on and a Secretlab chair. Shakeel felt that the wish was a very good start for him to continue doing more livestream in the future.

Shakeel's wish helped build his confidence and communication skills through his interactions with the media, streamers and public during his livestream. Having his most heartfelt wish granted, it left Shakeel with the biggest smile and an experience he will forever treasure.

## Building Wish Force Excellence

Our incredible group of volunteers is the driving force behind each and every wish journey, so it is our priority to ensure that our volunteer network is supported, motivated and empowered to create a positive and lasting impact. A total of 14 engagement sessions were organised throughout the year as part of this commitment.



### Wish Granter Annual Meeting (WGAM) 2019

We started the year with our first-ever Wish Granter Annual Meeting organised to recognise the contributions of our volunteers and to build stronger collaborations to achieve the year's goals together. This was an inspiring and fruitful session that will be repeated annually moving forward.



### Wish Closure Days

Wish Closure Days are quick evening sessions held once a month to give volunteers a regular platform to discuss how wishes are progressing, to share ideas and to address enhance efficiencies of our programme delivery to ensure that we're doing all we can to bring the highest impact to each child and family.

## Referral Partners

Another integral part of the Wish Force is our 19 referral partners from various medical facilities and community organisations who collectively look after children with critical illnesses in Singapore. 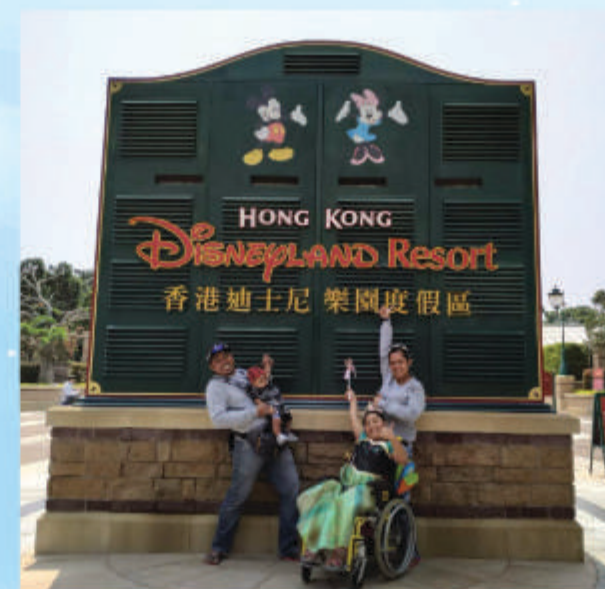

### Governance: The Board of Directors

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors all of whom are volunteers with no business relations with the Foundation. They are appointed on the strength of their knowledge, skills, expertise, and ability to contribute to the development of the Foundation, as well as needs of the Foundation. After each Annual General Meeting, the Board elects amongst themselves the office bearers for a one-year period.

The Board conducts annual evaluation to determine the effectiveness of the Board. The By-laws of the Foundation sets out the term limits of the Board members. No employee has been appointed to the Board of Directors during the year.

The Foundation has established a policy setting forth matters reserved for the Board's decision.

### Management and Avoidance of Conflict of Interest Policy

The Foundation has a written policy of management and avoidance of conflicts of interest involving directors, staff and volunteers.

All Board members are required to declare conflict of interest to the Foundation at the start of their terms, biannually or as soon as such conflict or the possibility of such conflict arises. The By-laws of the Foundation provides that all members of the Board shall receive no compensation other than reimbursement of reasonable Wish Granting expenses.

All employees are required to declare conflict of interest at the point of hire and biannually. Staff are not involved in setting his or her own remuneration.

Any interest in contracts with vendors, interests in other organisations, joint ventures, recruitment and remuneration of staff with close relationship have to be fully disclosed and the person with the conflict of interest is excluded from the discussion and approval of such transactions.

### Reserve Management

The primary objective in the management of the Foundation's reserve is to ensure that it maintains a strong and healthy level of reserves and working fund ratio, in order to support its operations. The Foundation has a cash reserve policy of holding not more than 3 years' operating expenditure. Such reserve shall be invested in financially prudent deposits and investments.

### Investment Policy

The Foundation has an established investment policy aimed at ensuring the safety of principles while managing liquidity and to provide the highest return on investment using authorised instruments. Surplus funds are placed in bank fixed deposits, government securities, corporate bonds and funds. All investments are approved by the Board of directors. Fixed deposit placements may be authorised by the Finance & Investment Committee.

### Enterprise Risk Management

The Foundation is committed to the effective management of risks as an integral part of the daily activities to ensure compliance with regulatory obligations, protect its integrity and assets. As part of its risk management process, the Foundation reviews and updates the risk register periodically. Process owners review their processes, assess the adequacy of controls, and put in place mitigating measures where applicable. Management of key risks will be discussed at Board meetings.

### Remuneration of Executives

No member of staff received an annual remuneration above \$100,000 for the year. The annual remuneration of the 3 highest paid staff is classified as follows:
