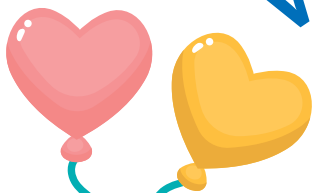

**Dr Jason Chng, 28**

Wish Granted: 2004  
*"I wish to have a desktop with a flat screen!"*

"Going through a serious illness as a child is incredibly distressing and tough. Even small acts of support can mean the world, and having a wish granted gives us hope, strength, and the drive to keep going," reflected Jason, now 28.

Jason was only eight years old when he was diagnosed with acute leukaemia. Not long after, his wish for a desktop computer was granted. "It might seem simple, but it meant so much to me," he recalled. "I used it all through school, and we still have the original frame at home."

Following his remission, Jason returned to school with renewed determination. He later studied at the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine at the National University of Singapore, and is now training in Anatomical Pathology, where he helps doctors diagnose diseases by examining tissues and cell samples. "My fascination with how illnesses work led me here. I wanted to make a difference."



Today, Jason is happily settled into married life with his wife and continues to make space for passions like classical music and musicals.

To wish children, Jason shares this: "To whomever may be fighting illness, you are not alone and there are people out there who will wholeheartedly support you through your journey. Keep up your fighting spirit and keep doing what you love."



"The experience of my wish didn't just change my perspective; it gave me the courage to pursue my passions, no matter the odds," said Satya, 23.

Satya's wish was to be a blacksmith, and in 2019, he and his sister travelled to Australia to visit their older sister. There, Satya had the chance to learn blacksmithing. Despite the complications due to his dialysis, the trip was a dream come true. "It was the first time I could travel with my family since my illness, and it meant the world to me," Satya shared.



One of the highlights of his wish was spending a day with a blacksmith group in Perth, where he created a knife from scratch. "It was more than just learning a craft; it was about feeling alive and capable," he revealed.

Now pursuing a Bachelor's degree in Biomedical Science at La Trobe University in Australia, Satya hopes to keep growing both personally and academically, and will continue his studies in the years to come.

## “I wish to go to Monster Jam!”

*Tharsan, 6, medulloblastoma*

Six-year-old Tharsan has faced more challenges than most of us can imagine. Living with medulloblastoma, he has limited mobility and requires a tracheostomy to breathe. Yet through it all, his spirit remains bright, and his love for Monster Trucks has been a source of happiness for him.

“The surgery was the toughest part. After surgery, we could only see him three times a day. He was in ICU for one month,” shared his mother, Ramya. Despite these challenges, Tharsan’s father kept his spirits high with hours of Monster Truck videos, watching and cheering alongside him.

When Monster Jam announced its Singapore stop in their world tour, Tharsan’s family couldn’t have imagined attending, that is until his wish granters stepped in. They organised a birthday celebration, with the family in matching tees, and gave him an advent calendar of surprises to build excitement for his big day.

Then came the big day: Tharsan enjoyed a VIP experience at Monster Jam, meeting his favourite drivers, exploring the pits, and even appearing on the arena’s big screen broadcast internationally. The day was filled with wide grins, unbridled joy, and unforgettable memories shared with his family — proving that even amidst life’s challenges, moments of happiness can roar as loudly as a Monster Truck engine.

# “I wish to experience the Ferrari Factory Panoramic Tour in Italy!”

*Ahmad, 5, lymphatic malformation*

Ahmad, a cheerful five-year-old, lives with a rare lymphatic malformation that requires ongoing treatment. Throughout his medical journey, his love for cars has been a constant source of comfort and strength. When it came time to share his wish, Ahmad knew exactly what he wanted: to visit the Ferrari Factory in Italy!

In the weeks leading up to the trip, Ahmad and his family shared meaningful experiences such as watching the “Grand Prix of Europe” at the cinema and building a Ferrari LEGO set together. These experiences helped build excitement and gave him something joyful to look forward to as his big wish day approached!

In Maranello, Italy, Ahmad explored the Ferrari Factory on a private tour, seeing his favourite cars being built stage by stage. For Ahmad, it was more than a trip. It was a break from hospital rooms and medical routines. A chance to laugh freely, explore with his family, and feel like any other child again.

# “I wish to fundraise for other children!”

*Aaron, 17, Pfeiffer syndrome*



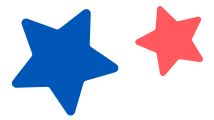
Aaron, a 17-year-old living with Pfeiffer syndrome, has always found comfort and expression through art. For his wish, he dreamed of helping other children by hosting an art fundraiser, a selfless wish that turned his passion into an act of giving.

With the incredible support of Micron Technology Singapore, Aaron’s art auction truly came to life. Employees rallied together and bid enthusiastically, raising \$7,018, which was then doubled to \$14,036 thanks to the Micron 1-for-1 matching commitment. The momentum continued with a follow-up online fundraiser and in total, over \$18,000 was raised and every dollar went directly toward granting life-changing wishes for children facing critical illnesses.

Aaron’s journey was not without its own challenges though. Navigating multiple surgeries, learning difficulties, epilepsy, and leg fractures, he still focused on others, determined to make a meaningful difference. “There are children who aren’t as fortunate as me, so I wanted to help Make-A-Wish grant their wishes,” Aaron shared.

From planning the fundraiser to seeing his artwork appreciated by supporters, Aaron demonstrated courage, kindness, and selflessness. Thanks to Micron and everyone who supported him, this wish showed how one teen’s dream can inspire and empower many, leaving a lasting impact beyond his own journey.

# “I wish to have a Rifton Pacer!”



*Maira, 11, cerebral palsy*

Maira, a lively 11-year-old, has lived with cerebral palsy since birth. Moving from her bed to a chair or standing for longer periods requires daily effort and support. At school, she used a Rifton pacer to aid her therapy, but at home, she only had her wheelchair, limiting her progress. Her simple but meaningful wish was for her own pacer, so she could practice standing and walking independently every day.

On wish day, Maira's home was filled with laughter, excitement, and anticipation. When she saw her new customised pacer, her face lit up instantly. The device was designed to support her mobility and allow her to practice upright walking safely and comfortably. Her parents shared that daily mobility practice at home gives her a stronger chance of independent walking, and may mean she needs fewer invasive interventions down the road.

This wish has transformed Maira's daily life, providing consistency in therapy, fostering her independence, and lifting her spirits — bringing hope and reassurance to her family.

# “I wish to meet F1 driver Max Verstappen!”

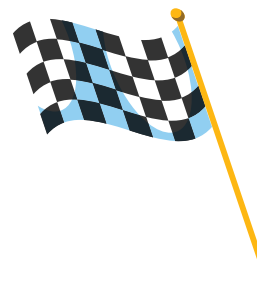
*Maxim, 8, leukaemia*

*Yue Rou, 13, lupus nephritis*



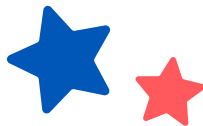
Yue Rou, a bright and determined 13-year-old, has always been captivated by Chinese period dramas. Her wish was heartfelt: to star and sing in her very own music video.
